

Guided walks around Ipswich

Public walks are available from May to September on Tuesdays and Thursdays, occasional Saturdays and Wednesday evenings. Walks commence at the Tourist Information Centre, have a duration of approximately 90 minutes and cost £3 per person. Please refer to the tables on this leaflet for walk titles and times.

Group Walks for Clubs and Societies may be pre-booked for any time of the year. Tours are arranged to suit your group's requirements and booked through the Tourist Information Centre. The cost is £3 per head with a minimum charge of £30. Parties are limited to 20 persons per guide.

Group Walks for Schools/Children Teachers can pre book walks themed to fit a particular study topic. The charge for this service is £30 per guide. A group to be a maximum of 15 pupils - accompanying adults free.

Armchair Walks are illustrated talks given by an Ipswich Tourist Guide at the host venue. Booked through the Tourist Information Centre there is a selection of titles to choose from. The cost is £35 for a one hour presentation

Childrens Walks with fun themes, such as Horrible History are available, at a cost of £3 per child, during the school summer holiday as part of the Ipswich Borough Council activity scheme. Details are advertised in their brochure and the local press and available from the Tourist Information Centre.

Special Themed Walks take place throughout the year, cost £6 per person and include refreshments in a local restaurant. Refer to the table on this leaflet, ask at the TIC or watch the press for details.

Heritage Open Days Walks scheduled for this special weekend will be free of charge. See panel on this leaflet

Ipswich has a rich heritage from its Anglo Saxon origins through a prosperous medieval age, an industrial 19th century to today's revival of the historic waterfront. Hear all about it on a guided walk with an Ipswich Town Guide.

We offer a variety of walks bringing different aspects of this history to life. Follow in the footsteps of Henry VIII to the Shrine of our Lady, discover famous people connected with the town from Darwin and Dickens to Nelson and Giles. Visit the remains of a powerful priory or pause at an ancient, hidden, Jewish cemetery. Enjoy stunning architecture representing centuries of styles from Tudor merchants homes and Victorian grandeur to a modern, Norman Foster masterpiece. Discover how Ipswich merchants and maritime adventurers were amongst the first to circumnavigate the globe and settle in the New World.

Our Guides are either Ipswich Tourist or Blue Badge registered and all have their own styles. We cannot change the history - but anecdotes and different information always provide an entertaining walk.
